

The strange seed pods of the fountain clerodendrum (Clerodendrum minahassae) growing in the Moonlight Garden look like little red starfishes. The plants pictured above can all be found growing nearby.



The Hong Kong orchid tree (Bauhinia blakeana) north of the Security Station flowers along a central stem called a raceme that produces new flowers as it grows. There is also a white orchid tree in bloom in front of the Edison Caretaker's House.

Water lilies (Nymphaea spp.) delight in the reflecting pond at the center of Mina Edison's Moonlight Garden. This pond is meant to reflect the light of the moon at night, but its glassy surface also captures a stunning image of the daytime sky. Starburst bush is bursting to life south of the Pool Complex, and the ylang ylang just south of Edison's Study is starting to bloom again as well.
