Everyone loves monkey brush vine (Combretum rotundifolium), but nobody loves it as much as the bees do. It's not uncommon to see 6 or 7 bees busily attending each long, "stamenous" flower on this woody, South American vine. You'll find monkey brush vine blooming in the back of the Garden Shoppe this August.



The small, vibrant fruits of American beautyberry (Callicarpa americana) are technically edible, but they sure don't taste very good. However, this native plants is an incredibly valuable food source for wildlife!
